Micheal is spending Monday-Friday at the boys' home doing maintenance, getting to know the boys, and attempting to learn the language. Pray for that they will learn the language quickly to be better equipped to communicate the love of God to the people.

Kokura: Pat shared that funds are coming together to support a manager to assist her with the Oaks of Righteousness ministry. This is an answer to prayer that will take much pressure off of her. Pray for her as she continues fundraising and visiting family and friends before her return to Uganda in December. Pray that things will continue to run smoothly at Oaks of Righteousness in her absence and that she will be refreshed for ministry when she returns later this year.

Weatherby: Gene and Janice are looking forward to working with Jonathan Eby who joined them in South Africa late September. We praise God for the way things came together for Jonathan. Pray that his many gifts and talents will be tools in reaching the amaXhosa people – especially the men, who are hard to reach – as he shares his agricultural knowledge with them.

Your Church: pray that your church will bring the love of Jesus to a society searching for peace and hope in these times of unrest around the world.

Sri Lanka: We received a brief report from Pastor Abraham on political conditions and unrest in their nation but, for security reasons, he was unable to give details. He did share that a pastor was hospitalized with non-life-threatening injuries, following a brutal attack, and requested prayer for healing. There is an urgent need for prayer for peace. In spite of persecution the church is prospering. The foundation of a church structure that Pastor Abraham is overseeing is completed. Pray that funds will be provided to complete the structure.

Thrift Shop: Lease agreements are now being finalized by lawyers. Pray for our committee as we move forward in this business venture. We have been blessed with real team spirit and pray that we will continue to work in unity in the unforeseen that may arise.

Canada: Marlene Stairs has been approved for short-term mission trips to Kenya and India, in 2007. Pray for her as she raises necessary funds and prepares for these trips.
